June was a busy month. We had a flurry of events right at the end of the month and at the beginning of July. I appreciate all the people who came out for the events. The success of the activities were only possible because of you. August will be a slow month by comparison. Things pick back up in September as we begin our preparations for the American Legion Oratorical competition.

This month, we were involved in the Meridian Dairy Days parade, and the 4th of July event at Storey Park along with the Koffee Klatch and a national amateur radio event. You will also see elsewhere in the newsletter where our Honor Guard was very active as usual.

Last month you heard about a couple of grants that we applied for from the City of Meridian. One was for the installation of a flag pole and an American Flag on Cherry lane. While not specifically approved, the Council decided they could let the Parks Department install and maintain the pole and flag. Post 113 would have been a middleman with no real function. The other grant application related to the flag destruction program was approved. It is in the City Legal Department now getting the final touches prior to awarding the grant.

The disposal grant will pay for two collection sites within the city. One will be located at City Hall and the other at the Meridian Senior Center. The other piece of the grant is to purchase two burners and place them at Post 201 at the Idaho State Correction Center (ISCC). ISCC has the space and the personnel to conduct the flag disposal according the Flag Code.

In other news, Ralph Cavalieri not only is continuing with the training series during our meals, he is undertaking a project to upgrade our sound system for Zoom at the Post. He is working with a company to write another grant for the purchase and installation of the equipment.

Other significant activities on the horizon in addition to the Oratorical Contest are the Post 113 Christmas party, the Post 201 family's Christmas party, and Veterans Day celebration. All will require help to make them a success, so stay tuned. We also need to decide on our money making project. I will unveil one plan at the next meeting. Our September meeting will be attended by our Boys State and the Auxiliary Girls State attendees. The Auxiliary will be helping with the meal.

During the last meeting, you heard John Brekke talk about a Peer support team. That team will be available to offer assistance to veterans and families should difficulties arise. Please stay tuned as we flesh out the details of the team and how to contact them.

Sign in to My HealtheVet for Boise VA Users Change on July 23

Are you are receiving health care from the Boise VA? Beginning on Saturday, July 23, users of My HealtheVet portal (MHV) will be required to migrate to My VA Health portal. If you get stuck trying to get the new login process to work call the MHV Help Desk 877/327-0022. However, be advised you will need to continue to use the My HealtheVet portal to request prescription refills or renewals for medications ordered by VA providers from other VA medical facilities that are not using the new Electronic Health Record System. In addition, if you had VA health care from other VA facilities you will need to continue using MHV to access those records. The VA states this new process gives your account an extra layer of security to keep your VA information safe. https://myhealth.va.gov

Fast and Affordable Internet Service

If you or a Veteran you know is struggling to afford internet service, the <u>Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)</u> may put fast and reliable internet service within reach. ACP-eligible households can receive a discount of up to \$30 per month for broadband service and access to affordable high-speed internet plans from 20 leading internet providers. Eyewear Discount

Get up to 35% off your next pair of glasses with <u>Veterans Canteen Service (VCS)</u> for veterans enrolled in VA health care, their families, and caretakers. They will have access to discounts on a wide variety of both on regular prescription glasses and sunglasses.

Appeal your Service Disability Rating or Eligibility for Medical Retirement

Your separation, retirement and military disability rating is a personnel decision rather than a medical decision. While Military Health System (MHS) providers do the medical exams used by the Services, the MHS does not make the decision on your eligibility. Each Service has its own military appeals process. However, it's best to use a certified Idaho Service Officer to help you navigate and submit your appeal.

The PACT Act

This Act was passed by the US House in March 2022 and by the Senate earlier this month with broad bipartisan support. It's a comprehensive solution to provide access to VA health care and benefits for toxic-exposed veterans. This legislation will help veterans by establishing a permanent presumptive framework to address toxic exposure, foreign or domestic, past, present, and future.
