#### **Increased VA Claims Backlog**

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) expects to end 2023 with a record number of veterans filing disability claims. However, the recent hiring push at the agency should help expedite the process and not add to its backlog of unresolved cases, VA Secretary Denis McDonough has said. The VA's backlog of claims, which are cases waiting more than 125 days for a decision, has remained at roughly 200,000, despite the increase in filings triggered by the passage last year of a law that expanded toxic exposure benefits (i.e., The PACT Act). The VA is approaching 600,000 claims filed through the PACT Act since it was signed last year by the President. Last year, the VA received a record-breaking 1.7 million claims for benefits. This year has already seen 30% claims filing increase.

# Dan Nelson and Mission 43 Biography

Dan Nelson is a retired US Army Special Forces Officer (Green Beret) who started his military career upon graduating from Centennial High School (Boise, Idaho) in 2001. He left active duty and pursued his goal of playing college football and was honored to serve as the team captain of the UCLA Football Team from 2004-2006. Dan reentered the military after graduating UCLA with honors. His career as an airborne infantry officer and later a Green Beret afforded him the opportunity to deploy numerous times to Iraq, Afghanistan, The Philippines, North Africa, and the Arabian Levant. Dan is the recipient of multiple awards, including the Silver Star (the nation's third highest award for valor in combat), two Bronze Stars, and the Purple Heart.

Dan currently serves as the Director of Mission43, an Idaho based military veterans' initiative of the J.A. and Kathryn Albertson Family Foundation. Mission43 helps military families advance to a better quality of life in Idaho after the military through accelerating education, employment, and community opportunities.

# Interesting 4th of July facts every American should know

The history of the 4th of July is fascinating, but there are other interesting 4th of July facts every American should know. Here are five of the most notable:

- Some colonists celebrated Independence Day during the summer of 1776 by putting on mock funerals for King George III of England—symbolizing the death of the Crown's rule on America.
- The first annual commemoration of Independence Day happened on July 4, 1777, in Philadelphia.
- John Adams, a Founding Father and the second president of the United States, strongly believed Independence Day should be celebrated on July 2. He even refused to attend 4th of July events because he felt so strongly about July 2 being the correct date.
- Adams and Thomas Jefferson, a fellow Founding Father, both died on July 4, 1826. James Monroe, another U.S. president, also died on July 4th, but he passed in 1831.
- Thomas Jefferson was the first president to celebrate Independence Day at the White House, in 1801. The celebration featured horse races, parades, food and drinks—similar to the 4th of July celebrations we see today.

# July 2023 "Independence Day July 4th"





In the United States, July 4th is celebrated as Independence Day, commemorating the country's declaration of independence from Great Britain in 1776. It is a national holiday marked by fireworks, parades, barbecues, and various festivities.





Flag etiquette refers to the proper guidelines and practices for displaying, handling, and caring for the flag. Here are some key points about flag etiquette.

#### 1. Displaying the Flag:

- The flag should be flown from sunrise to sunset. If displayed at night, it should be properly illuminated.
- When flying the flag with other flags, the American flag should be placed in a position of prominence and higher than other flags.
- The flag should be hoisted briskly and lowered ceremoniously.

#### 2. Flag Handling:

- The flag should not touch the ground or any other objects below it.
  - When carrying the flag in a procession, it should be held high and never dipped to any person or thing.

• If the flag becomes worn or tattered, it should be properly retired and replaced with a new flag.

#### 2. Proper Folding:

- The American flag should be folded into a triangular shape, with only the blue field and stars visible.
- The flag-folding ceremony is a reverent process often performed at special events or funerals.

#### 3. Half-Staff Display:

- The flag should be flown at half-staff on specific designated days, as proclaimed by the President or the Governor, as a sign of mourning or respect.
- On Memorial Day, the flag should be displayed at half-staff until noon, and then raised to full staff for the remainder of the day.

#### 4. Disposal of Old or Damaged Flags:

 Old or damaged flags can be disposed of by a variety of sources, such as through a flag retirement ceremony conducted by the American Legion or other authorized organizations.

#### 5. Respectful Behavior:

- Encourage individuals to stand at attention and place their right hand over their heart when the flag passes in a parade or during the national anthem.
- Show respect for the flag and its symbolism, including refraining from wearing clothing items with the flag design or using it for advertising purposes.

#### Matthew 16:16-19 Continued:

This passage is a significant moment in the Gospels where Jesus acknowledges Peter's confession that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. Jesus then blesses Peter and declares that he will be the foundation of His church. The statement about the keys of the kingdom of heaven suggests that Peter will have authority in the spiritual realm to make decisions and judgments.

#### "What is considered a church"
