Meeting Notes

There are still issues with the K7BSE-147.940 repeater antenna. There is no timeline for its repair/replacement. We tried moving the net to 147.380, but the response was not good. Either folks didn't get the word about the change, or they didn't have the digital tone capability. It was decided to suspend the May 23, 2019 net so we could determine what frequency to move to. Rich is working on it. Notification of the new repeater and frequency will go out to members via email, and also be posted on the website.

If you would like to become a Volunteer Examiner (VE), you can apply to the ARRL for certification. You do not need to be an ARRL member, but you must hold at least a General Class License.

IDQSO Party will be March 13-14, 2020. The party committee will meet in October to start making plans. On the Events & Activities page of our website, there is a button where you can download the PowerPoint presentation.

The club will provide handheld radios to those performing security for Girls State. Anyone involved with either Boys State or Girls State will need to have an American Legion approved background check completed. The link to an approved provider will be posted on the website.

We will be opening an AmazonSmile account. After the account is opened, a portion of any AmazonSmiles.com purchases can be designated to go to the club. More on that later.

Equipment

Work on the radio room in the Veterans Memorial Building is almost complete. The bench tops are installed, and the electrical is all hooked up. We just need to install the antenna in the attic, and plug in the radios.

We have six Saber radios all of which need batteries and programming. Keith KJ7BZC has learned how to program them. A determination will be made at a later date to either keep the radios for member activities, or to sell them.

We have several HT1000 batteries on hand that need to be refurbished. Keith has had success in doing this in the past and has agreed to work on them.
