Veterans Day is also a day to learn more about the history of the United States military and the contributions that veterans have made to our country.

VETERANS DAY NOVEMBER 11th

Veterans Day, in the <u>United States</u>, national <u>holiday</u> (November 11) honouring veterans of the armed forces and those killed in the country's wars. The observance originated in 1919 on the first anniversary of the 1918 armistice that ended <u>World War I</u> and was known as <u>Armistice Day</u>. It was <u>commemorated</u> in 1921 with the burial of an unknown soldier from World War I at <u>Arlington National Cemetery</u> in Arlington, Virginia. Other countries that had lost soldiers in the conflict, such as Italy and Portugal, conducted similar ceremonies that year. The previous year, unknown soldiers had been interred at <u>Westminster Abbey</u> in London, England, and at the <u>Arc de Triomphe</u> in Paris, France.

November 11 became an official national holiday in the United States in 1938. In 1954 the name was changed to Veterans Day to honour those who had served in all U.S. wars. Ceremonies are held each year at the <u>Tomb of the Unknowns</u>, and floral <u>tributes</u> are placed on the graves of service men and women and at memorials throughout the country. Naturalization ceremonies have come to be an important part of the day's activities.

In <u>Britain</u>, <u>Canada</u>, Australia, and <u>France</u> November 11 is observed in honour of the veterans of World Wars I and II. In Britain the second Sunday of November is observed as <u>Remembrance</u> <u>Sunday</u>, and in Canada November 11 is observed as Remembrance Day. In Britain and the Commonwealth countries and in countries of Europe, it is common to observe two minutes of silence at 11:00 AM on November 11, the time and date of the World War I armistice in 1918.

<u>Poppies</u> have long been associated with World War I memorials through the poem "<u>In Flanders</u> <u>Fields</u>" by John McCrae, and in several countries paper poppies are sold to raise money for the support of veterans and are worn in the lapel as a sign of remembrance.

Membership Dues Raised:

- National is raising the dues by \$5.00, that is a fact. We in turn see only approximately \$7.50 from National out of the \$45.00 dues paid to National.
- Now we will only be getting approximately \$2.50 for anyone who goes online or sends their dues to National. Our post survives on that money. Money is very tight now and we will suffer tremendously if we don't raise our dues.
- It has been voted on and passed by all at the October meeting to raise our dues by \$10.00 to \$55.00 per year starting 1/1/24.
- We are aware of what this does to our veterans. But the post simply cannot survive on the approximately \$2.50 per member when the dues at National are increased.



I announced the activity I will be engaged in at the Post meeting in September. I again noted in the October meeting a little more of what "it" entails. I'll be leading a team working with the Barbara Morgan Stem Academy in Meridian as N7LGN (Post 113 Amateur Radio Club) in concert with NASA and a group called ARISS (Amateur Radio aboard the International Space Station). Flu Shots

Unfortunately, the Boise VA Medical Center has already completed their drive-thru flu shot clinics. However, you may still get a flu shot from the Boise VA medical center, in-network community pharmacies, urgent care locations nationwide or from various chain pharmacy retail stores like Walgreens. If you decide to go to a non-VA location, check to make sure you will be receiving a no-cost flu shot.

Overseas Cost-of-Living Cuts Will Take a Bite Out of Active Military Paychecks

Cuts to service members' overseas cost-of-living allowances are coming next month. Some service members are in for a major hit. For example, a specialist in the 11th Airborne Division based out of Alaska with one dependent will lose \$129 a month, according to an Army memo reviewed by the Military.com. A major with four dependents will lose \$464.68 per month. After delaying the cuts for nearly a year, the Defense Department announced in May that service members stationed overseas, including troops in Alaska and Hawaii, would see cuts to their cost-of-living allowance. Senior defense officials said in May that they were allowing combatant commands to protest the changes, but that they must provide data to show that the Pentagon's analysis of prices doesn't accurately reflect the situation on the ground. Senior defense officials argue that pay increases this year -- such as an across-the-board 4.6% pay raise for troops -- would actually leave service members with more money in their pockets, even accounting for the OCOLA decrease, despite overall living costs having risen rapidly with inflation.

Greetings,

Our group continues to grow. Our membership comes from the Legion family and the community. There are no dues for Legion family while the community pays \$12.00 per year. We have 33 Legion family members and 26 community members for a total of 59 members. We meet monthly on the fourth Wednesday of the month.



Our in-house repeater operates 24 hours a day 7 days a week on 443.000 MHz. It is both a traditional FM repeater and a Fusion (C4FM) digital repeater. Primarily used for Fusion, there are at least two national nets that operate through our repeater. We host two weekly nets on two meters. One is on the 146.94 MHz repeater and the other operates on 147.420 MHz simplex.

Each month we offer FCC license examination sessions open to the public. We have a cadre of 23 Extra Class operators certified by the ARRL Volunteer Examinator Coordinator. We offer testing for all classes of licenses and license renewal.

Last month we had John Kernkamp, WB4YJT, discuss Vector Network Analyzers which are very useful, if not necessary to assess an antenna system. John is nationally recognized as an inventor and engineer. We will not be meeting in the month pf November because of Thanksgiving, However, we will meet in December where we will have a "Christmas pot Luck" and a white elephant exchange.

We'mentioned this before, but our long-range plans include working with and operating a special event station at Barbara Morgan Stem Academy in Meridian. That event will allow students from the school and all over the Treasure Valley the opportunity to talk to astronauts aboard the International Space Station. Because of the necessary planning and preparation, the event is slated to take place in 2025.
